# BARLBY AND OSGODBY MAGAZINE AUTUMN 2022- NO.267 NOTES FROM COUNCIL MEETINGS REPORTS and ISSUES RAISED

# **Public Session**

Representatives from Barlby High School (Aspire Academy) attended to advise on action taken to ameliorate the oil contamination at the Ponds site and explained that the incident occurred during re-filling of a kerosene tank by School contractors leading to an overflow, which then found its way via land drains into the Ponds. The School arranged specialist contractors for a clear up, including absorbent pads in the water. The Town Council had also incurred some costs, due to local contractors attending the site to block a pipe to stop the spillage spreading.

The RSPCA/Swan Rescue were contacted and 2 adult swans were rescued but all the cygnets were lost. The Town Council sought assurances that this would not happen again and as landowners, requested to be kept fully informed. Aspire representatives were thanked for their attendance.

A member of the public raised concerns about water use in the event of a fire at the Meadow. The Meeting was advised that there is insufficient water in the drainage system for use in an incident and that parts of the drainage system are Yorkshire Water and Internal Drainage Board assets. After due discussion it was agreed to make enquiries with the other organisations.

Members of the Public attended to raise concerns about the Osgodby housing land allocations in the Selby District Local Plan (Pre-Submission Draft) – currently out for consultation. Objections were : that identified sites are too large for Osgodby, the land off Sand Lane has potential for 72 dwellings and the plan indicates an unsatisfactory access onto Sand Lane. The SEND site has a vehicle access onto the A63 and both sites are good quality arable land. Concerns also raised about inadequate infrastructure in the Village and an enforcement issue in Osgodby.

A Member of the Public raised concerns about vegetation overgrowing footpaths in Barlby Village near the Laurels and Pindars Way. Cllr S Duckett and Cllr J Underwood agreed to investigate. Another Member of the Public came to observe the Meeting.

## REPORTS

Community Police – a Strategy to combat violence towards women was circulated. Community Safety Charter – noted. A Drive Safe campaign letter was read to the Meeting. Reports of recent vandalism had been sent to the Police, however when trying to report incidents by phone, the wait could be up to an hour and the online report form is designed for members of the public and takes up to 20 minutes per report. It was proposed to write to Nigel Adams MP with concerns about infrastructure and advise that reporting arrangements are not fit for purpose, agreed.

Responses from MP Nigel Adams and the Community Police were read to the meeting. It was suggested that Parishes could benefit from a joint meeting with the Police and MP. After a discussion it was proposed to ask YLCA to invite Nigel Adams to a Branch Meeting and ask Selby Police to a Town Council Meeting.

#### Countryside

Barlby Woodland and Meadow – a stile at Cherry Tree Walk needs replacing. The hay has been baled and the hedges will be cut shortly. Osgodby Pond – some clearance at the ponds is required. Barlby Ponds – clearance of the rushes at the ponds has been completed. The High School contractors have been on site again and the swans have returned to the ponds. The Old Railway Walk – a sapling to be removed.

County and District Councillors – Cllr S Duckett gave a report on proposed partnership working with York City Council and the North Yorkshire Unitary Authority, the scope of Area Committees for the new Unitary Authority and an update on a local Charity. Councillor Duckett also gave reports on applying for free School meals (which will be put on the notice boards) a meeting with the PFCC, the Proposed SEND School and enhanced units for other Schools. New classrooms for Hilltop School are programmed for 2023. Cllr Duckett has also been accepted as a Board Member for the Olympia Allotments CIC.

Representatives – the Council Manager gave an update on a recent YLCA Meeting including : work of YLCA/NALC, the Levelling Up Bill, training, and recent consultations. Cllr J Underwood gave a report on a recent Drax Meeting and how biofuel costs have spiralled.

Health and Safety issues – included a report of wild bees at Wainhomes Play Area. Thanks expressed to Mike Freer (Council Handyman) and another beekeeper for prompt action to re-house the bees. Concerns about a tree on Pindars Way, some thinning to be carried out.

# PLAY AREAS/AMENITY OPEN SPACE/ALLOTMENTS

Allotments – a grant award presentation at the Recreation Road Allotment site was attended by Cllr S Duckett and the Olympia Allotment Committee, who expressed sincere thanks for the Town Council's support. After inspecting the Parish sites, the Allotment Manager awarded 'Best Kept Plot' certificates to Plot holders at St Leonards and Gardeners Lane. A hosepipe ban is in operation at both sites, but prior to this water use increased dramatically due to the hot weather. It was agreed that the Allotment rules be amended to add that hosepipe bans may be implemented at any time.

Play Area/Open Space – the new equipment at Wainhomes and Bungalow Road has been installed. There has been vandalism including small fires (melted plastic bottles & wheelie bin) plus litter, smashed bottles and graffiti and late night youths/music and bullying – all passed to the Police. It was proposed and agreed that the High School be invited to a Meeting to discuss the anti-social behaviour. Bungalow Road Transfer – the Council Manager sent a site plan of the area to be transferred to ForFarmers, following request for updates.

# STREET LIGHTS& FURNITURE, ROADS and PATHS

Street Lights – lights out at the A63 roundabout. To be reported.

Highways – footway schemes circulated. 30 mph speed limit order for North Duffield advertised in the Library. A request for a safe crossing point near the Garden Centre is to be passed to Cllr K Arthur/NY Highways. The landowners of the land at the corner of Bramley Avenue have been contacted by NY Highways as the trees are overgrowing the highway. Cllr S Duckett gave a report on a site meeting with NY Councillor Duncan, to discuss Howden Road and the petrol filling station site in Barlby.
